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Basics and Expectations

Confirmation will be broken up into Years 1, 2, and 3. Students may begin year 1 anytime beginning in 7th grade or later. <u>Our program will focus on four main experiences for these youth. Namely, Belonging & Community, Meaningful Worship Participation, Faithful Learning, and Impactful Service.</u> These areas of focus will be achieved through Worship at Our Savior's Lutheran, Classes on Sunday mornings, a Mentor Program, and Service Opportunities.

Years 1 & 2 will meet nearly every week on Sunday mornings following worship. We will meet in a large group together (not divided by year) and our teaching focus (catechism) will rotate between a specific Bible focus and a Lutheran Theology focus (themes and thinking about God). You will also begin to develop a relationship with a Mentor from the congregation during these first two years. This final piece is NEW for 2023-2024.

Year 3 will meet once a month on Sunday mornings following worship alongside the Year 1 and 2 youth (highlighted in the schedule below), as well as their mentors but will have a breakout group of just Year 3 students on those Sundays. Year 3 will deepen their relationships with their adult church mentor. If you or your mentor has a specific conflict with the highlighted Mentor Class Sunday, let me know as you can substitute a different class as long as we communicate ahead of time.

Class Participation: We encourage all students to make their faith life a focal priority in their life, and during this season that includes confirmation. Confirmation is a great opportunity to ask important faith questions and to grow in your faith and to grow close with your peers and church friends that may last a lifetime. We know that there are things that come up, there are competing commitments that we all have. I expect you at all of the classes unless you let me know ahead of time of your absence. You can text or call me, so it is easy to let me know. If something is going on talk to me, as communication is so important in all relationships and we can make a plan.

Worship Participation: A portion of EVERY confirmation class is going to be spent discussing a piece of the worship service that happened that day. You'll be able to process what you heard and experienced and get some answers to

questions you may have. You will have the opportunity within class to sign up for specific worship leadership positions on specific Sundays. Please plan to bring your calendars with you so you don't schedule a conflict for yourself. I also encourage you to plan on being in worship every week, as then when the occasional thing does come up you will have the flexibility to miss without feeling like you are missing out. Again, communication is important, and we certainly can come up with a plan to help navigate nearly anything. A new portion of the Worship Participation expectation is that you are encouraged to sit with your mentor at least once a month in worship.

Service Participation: We will have a number of opportunities to do meaningful service for God's world throughout the school year. In order to make sure those opportunities can be truly meaningful and responsive to the community these dates aren't on the calendar, but will be called out in regular email communication to you as well as in Sunday services and the weekly newsletter (The E-Blast).

Mentorship Program: Each confirmation youth will be partnered with an adult member of Our Savior's in good standing. You can absolutely select your own member if you have someone in mind (we actually encourage this!), yet we also know that many youth in our congregation don't know many adults that aren't related to them at church. If you are selecting your own, please know mentors must be a member of Our Savior's and an adult over 21+ that you are not related to. If not selecting your own mentor, we will work to partner you with someone who will walk with you throughout your confirmation experience. Our Mentorship program consists of 2 formal pieces, 1) Joining you in worship (see worship participation above); and 2) On the last class of each month Mentors will join us for class. These Mentor Classes are highlighted in in the Schedule.

Youth Group: Although not required in any way, you are encouraged to participate in our very active youth programing at Our Savior's. The youth group meets most Sunday nights to play and develop a great, supportive, community.

Confirmation Day: The confirmation service will take place on the first Sunday of May each year. (May 5, 2024 for this year!). Youth who have completed their 3 years will be invited to write their faith paper and prepare for Confirmation Day.

Are you Ready? If so please register online at www.oursaviorshartland.org before the first week of classes so that we have updated contact information for you and supplies ready for you to fully participate this year. There is a \$25 materials fee per year which you can pay as a part of registration via card or by making a check out to Our Savior Lutheran with "Confirmation" in the memo line.

Date	Learning Theme (Blue Highlighted dates are Mentor Days)
9/10	The City Explore the theme of the city throughout the story of the Bible—from the first city built by Cain to the final garden city in the new creation.
9/17	Anointing What is the purpose of anointing? We'll work to understand this ritual throughout the Bible and how it relates to Jesus and his followers.
9/24	The Last Will Be First Trace the theme of the firstborn through the story of the Bible in this animated video. Discover how God overturns human systems and redefines power as love.
10/1	Blessing and Curse Trace the theme of blessing and curse in the Bible to see how Jesus defeats the curse and restores the blessing of life to creation.
10/8	Eternal Life Jesus offers people access to eternal life or "life unto the age." What does that mean?

	God is a generous god, but throughout the Bible, humans hoard God's good gifts. We will look at how to live by God's generous example.
